When his followers took Jesus down from the cross, they held his lifeless body in their arms. His lungs has ceased taking breath; his heart has ceased beating.

Strangely, we must fully accept the fact that he died, in order to fully embrace his resurrection. We tend to focus on the events prior to his death, probably because it's painful to contemplate the unjust abuse of the Son of God. Yet the truth is, he was dead for three days, not just unconscious for just a few hours. His body was cold. Wrapped in grave cloths. Sealed behind a rolling stone in a tomb.

But then on that third day, when he returned to life, his body was so renewed that his followers didn't immediately recognise him. Once they know the truth, the good news could not be stopped. Our Savour lives! Tell the world!
