Nominees are announced in each category and the cameras shift to the nervous contenders anxiously waiting in the audience, the tension obvious in their faces. *Will I win*, they wonder, *or just be an "also nominated" footnote?*

Next the presenter tears open the envelope, reads the contents, and call out, "The Oscar goes to..." Suddenly the cameras focus on the winner as he or she hurries up to the stage to receive the award and bask in the glory of recognition.

<u>Amalgamation of Both Schools – Boys & Girls</u>

Discussions around this topic have been going on for some time. During the past few months a number of

meetings have taken place between staff members, board of managements and parents/guardians of both schools. This part of the process was finalised last week when 71.5% of parents/guardians voted in favour of We are aware that 28.5% of parents/guardians were not in favour, however we will do everything within our power to ensure that the transition from singles sex schools to co-ed will be as smooth and professionally carried out as possible. Our aim is to provide the best possible education for the children today and going forward into the future. The next part of the process is to seek approval from the Patron Most Rev Bishop Seamus Freeman SAC and the Department of Education. We are also aggressively seeking a parcel of land adjacent to the schools in order to begin the process of having a State of the Art Co-Ed School on one site. We will keep you all updated as the process develops and look forward to your co-operation and support. Please keep all this in your prayers. "Unless the Lord build this project we labour in vain."
