# **National Eucharistic Congress 2015**

The Irish Catholic bishops Conference will celebrate a National Eucharistic Congress on the weekend of 26-27<sup>th</sup> September 2015 at Knock Shrine, Co. Mayo. The congress will serve both as a spiritual preparation for the 51<sup>st</sup> International Eucharistic Congress 2016 in Cebu next January, and as a opportunity to focus in the light of our Eucharistic communion, on some of the important pastoral questions in the life of the Church at the present time. The theme for the National Congress, echoing the theme of IEC2016, is "Christ, our Hope" (col 1:27). It is our intention that, in so far as possible, this theme would be reflected in all homilies and presentations given at the National Eucharistic Congress.

<u>St Kevin's Church Carrigeen</u> was first built around 1700- a thatched barn like structure. The PP then was Patrick Brophy. It was rebuilt in 1801 by general subscription - John Fitzpatrick was then PP. how much it changed is impossible to say but presumably it was on the same site but higher. The church was rebuilt almost from the foundations in 1893 when Fr Patrick Phelan was PP. Anyone who may have old photographs we would like to hear from you.
