Second Sunday of Lent

TODAY

There are two days in every week about which we should not worry, two days which should be kept free from fear and apprehension. One of these days is *yesterday* with it's mistakes and cares, its faults and blunders, its aches and pains. Yesterday has passed forever beyond our control. All the money in the world cannot bring back yesterday. We cannot undo a single act we performed, we cannot erase a single word we said.

Yesterday is gone!

The other day we should not worry about is *tomorrow* with it's possible adversities, its burdens, its large promise and poor performance. Tomorrow is also beyond our immediate control. Tomorrow's sun will rise either in splendour or behind a mask of clouds - but it will rise. Until it does, we have no stake in tomorrow, for it is yet unborn. This leaves only one day - today. Any man can fight the battles of just one day. It is only when you and I add the burdens of those two awful entities - yesterday and tomorrow - that we break down. It is not the experience of today that drives men mad it is the remorse and bitterness for something which happened yesterday and the dread of what tomorrow may bring.
